Dear Beloved Parishioners and Friends,

In his letter to the Corinthians, Saint Paul says, 'if there is no resurrection of the dead, Christ himself has not been raised. And if Christ has not been raised our preaching is void of content and your faith is empty too." (1 Cori 15:13-14)

Today is a joyous occasion of celebrating Easter, the resurrection of Jesus Christ, promising hope of eternal life in every believer's life. During Holy Week, we have been journeying with Jesus's final days of earthly life, when He physically suffered, was crucified, and died for our sins. The central truth of the Christian faith revolves around His death and resurrection that fulfill the Old Testament prophecies.

When sin entered the world, separating us from His grace, God had a divine plan to save mankind. Through His unwavering love, He restored the broken relationship between God and humankind

through the ultimate sacrifice of Jesus Christ. He was pierced for our transgressions, crushed for our iniquities, and by his wounds we are healed" (Isaiah 53:5). And His resurrection proves that God keeps His promises, as it is written: "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life" (John 3:16).

The Resurrection of Jesus is a celebration of victory over sin and death and a time to rejoice for the gift of eternal life. The resurrection of Jesus Christ was evidenced by His empty tomb and the appearances of the resurrected Jesus on multiple occasions to His disciples as well as many others. Jesus commissioned his disciples to preach the Good News to all nations and ascended into heaven.

Amidst the Easter celebrations, remember the core truth of His death and resurrection and live as witnesses to His love by sharing the good news and Jesus' teachings

John 20:1-9

On the first day of the week Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early, while it was still dark, and saw that the stone had been taken away from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him'. So Peter went out with the other disciple, and they were going towards the tomb.

Both of them were running together, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. And stooping to look in, he saw the linen cloths lying there, but he did not go in. Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb. He saw the linen cloths lying there, and the face cloth, which had been on the head of Jesus, not lying with the linen cloths but folded up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple, who had reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed; for as yet they did not understand the Scripture, that he must rise from the dead.
